I'm not certain but I think a Mr Potter was headmaster at one time. Miss Dodsworth lived here and would take in lodgers. One lodger Ann Bradshaw was a primary school teacher at Albury school. My grandfather William King born in 1879 was a pupil at the school in the village hall and would walk from Stock House, Farley Green. Many years later my husband was working in the village hall cellar and found his name on a coat peg.

The Chemist shop: Mr and Mrs Francis lived here and the shop was always very neat and tidy. Often you would go in and would have to wait for Mr Francis to come up from his living room downstairs. Before it was a chemist it was owned and run as a drapers shop by the Foard family. Also a photography business.

The Post Office: George, Annie Fuller and Helen (known as Nellie). They sold the usual stamps and envelopes, sealing wax and string, as well as sweets in paper cones and also had a lending library that always looked quite old and dusty.

Along the wall opposite the Post Office is the Forge. The father of Miss Sherlock who lived in Forge Cottage was the blacksmith/farrier. Mr Sherlock Snr was a farrier and the house was eventually tenanted by his daughter Eleanor. Her house also doubled up as a doctor's surgery and Dr James Patterson and later Drs John and Margaret Louden took over as local GPs. You would all line up in her hallway and then the consultation would be in her back sitting room.

(Originally for the rectors at the Apostolic church) No 1: Mr and Mrs Percy Bartlett and daughter Linda, No 2: Mr and Mrs Pop Hollingdale, No 3: Mrs Mant, No 4: Mr and Mrs George King and daughters Sheila and Susan. (I was born here in 1941 and delivered by Nurse Triscott, the village midwife).

Originally two cottages. Now demolished and replaced with one house. The cottages were occupied by Mr and Mrs Ede to the left and Mrs Hughes and her lodger Tom Simmonds who worked at Parfree's garage as a mechanic.

Mr and Mrs Harding and daughter Vera. Vera married Jimmy Rolland and moved to Church lane with their children Victor, Maureen and Melvin.

Following 091: The next two cottages one either side of the passage: Mrs Furze & Mrs Day lived on the left side and Mr and Mrs Edwards lived to the right. Mr Edwards worked for Botting's mill.

The Butchers Shop: Mr Jack Miles and his nephew George Ethington ran the butcher shop. Behind the shop was the slaughter house and as I lived next door at the Bakers it was usual for a Monday afternoon for the lorry to arrive and deposit cows, sheep and pigs and take them to the slaughterhouse on their final journey. The noise was dreadful and I got quite upset listening to it. Mr Miles died and George took over for several years but unfortunately he got knocked over in the street while unloading a vehicle. Very unfortunate as the lorry would have normally reversed up the drive, but with very icy roads that day they decided to unload on the street. The local doctor needed to pull in behind the lorry as traffic was coming and he was unable to stop and crushed George with his car. George eventually had his leg amputated and as he wasn't able to work again the shop closed.

Harry King and his wife Eliza ran the bakery for quite a while. He was born in Albury and when he retired it was taken over in 1925 by William King (my grandfather and no relation to Harry King). William was born in Ewhurst and moved to Stock House, Shophouse Lane in Farley Green. He married a local girl Fanny Jolly from Cherrymans Farm in 1904 and moved to Croydon and had their own bakery business there before moving to Albury in 1925.

The Garage: Mr and Mrs Parfree Snr, then Mrs and Mrs Arthur Parfree and children Peter and Enid. The next family in the garage was Norman and Ann Thomas with Jennifer and Enid. The next family in the garage was Norman and Ann Thomas with Jennifer and Caroline. Cottages next to the garage: No 1: Mrs Howe, No 2: Mr and Mrs Merritt and Mr Beagly who was Mrs Merritt's father. I remember him sitting on the wall and spitting quite a lot. Garage Cottage: Mr and Mrs Smith, then Peter Parfree and his wife Peggy moved in when they married and when Arthur Parfree moved to Farley Green, Peter and Peggy moved into the Garage and had 2 children James and Janet. Much later it became a Post Office run by Mr and Mrs Edward Merritt son of Mrs Merritt in Weston Yard and Mrs Dorothy Merritt (the daughter of Mr and Mrs King at the bakery).

Mr and Mrs Sid Fry and daughters June and Janet are the earliest that I remember. Daughter June married and took over years later with her husband Ken Peacock and ran the hotel for several years. They had a son, Andrew. Next came The Luggs who upset the village people when they had the beautiful red Virginia Creeper taken off the walls. Then Tom King and his wife took over, and after he gave up running the hotel he moved to Postford cottages.

The Forge was next door and the blacksmiths house was next door to that. Mr and Mrs Barker lived and worked here. They had 3 sons Brian, Ralf and Bob. I remember having the task of delivering phone messages to Mr Barker while he worked in the Forge as they didn't have a phone at the time. I can still recall the smell of burning hooves.

The Barn in the yard at the back is now used by Beacon Roofing but prior to this Basil Tebbenham used it as a builders yard before he moved to Chilworth.

Bidwell House: Next door to the shop lived Mr and Mrs Charlie and sons John and Michael. Later on they moved to the Lodge Gates at Park Railing on Albury Heath. Swiss Cottage: (now March Cottage) The Cooper family lived here and worked as tailors and dressmakers. Several generations have lived and worked here as tailors. The back room to the right of the building was the work room and the front room was the showroom with all the bales of cloth from the floor to the ceiling shelves. The Pettit family came next with sons Paul and James. Basil and his sister Phyllis delivered milk around the area and this came after their parents Mr and Mrs Pettit gave up Birmingham Farm, from where the milk was originally delivered. Swiss Cottage also doubled up as a doctor's surgery and Dr James Patterson and later Drs John and Margaret Louden took over as local GPs. Front area as a waiting room and the back room as a surgery.

Mr and Mrs Pratt. Bakers and grocers. Mr and Mrs Chris Nicholas managed the shop. Before they moved to the shop they lived in Church Lane. The next tenants were the Woodruff family

The small cottage by the gates of Old Rectory. Mrs Ansell lived here in her tiny cottage that hung over the Tillingbourne stream

Mr and Mrs Eaden and family. After the Eadens came the Skeltons. Win Browne's memoirs have details of previous tenants
