



Down Cottage is No. 6 in a row of attached cottages, Guildford Lane Cottages, c. 1830. Brick on ground floor with tile hanging on first (though this has been removed from Down Cottage. Wash house and Larder now under a cat-slide roof may once have been lean-to's.

Brickwork to ground floor painted white. Hoods over doors. Timber in Down Cottage not intended to be exposed, but have thin carpenter's marks. Only three chimneys to whole row (central), with 2 chimneys for nos. 2 & 5 at back. Three dormers remained at back.

Brickwork in Flemish garden wall bond. Rafters coupled by ceiling joists with central longitudinal spine beam, & collar over main partition

6 Cottages on land called Bloody Heaps Hill sold to Mr. Whippourne - "lately erected" later bought by Albury Estate & later still by White Lane Farm.

Similar in plan to "High Dudgeon", Albury Heath.
