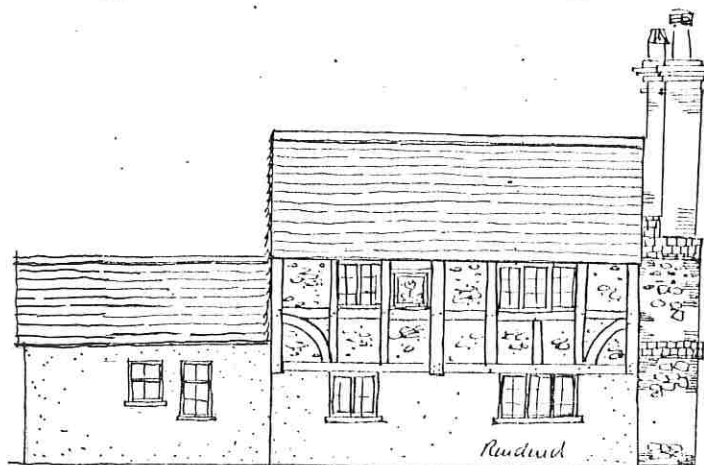


An early 17C. end chimney house of two bays, timber framed with gabled tiled roof and outshot.

Sturdy framing in square panels with curved tension braces. Sandstone and ironstone masonry to first floor in N. wall, now rendered below. Other walls tile hung. Chimney of sandstone blocks with brick dressings, 2 shafts, slightly away from wall. Bread oven gone, chimney diminishes over bread oven, but leaves of roof for bacon loft, with possible access from bedroom. Base of outshot of sandstone and ironstone, built up later in brick & gabled. Floor sunk as ground falls away to South. Possibly cat-slide roof originally. Inglenook had four centred arch, now gone, or has bedroom fireplace over. Spine beam chamfered.

Internal tie beams heavily cambered. Ceiled at wall plate level for attic, with possible window in East gable. Clapped purlins, Queen posts and inclined struts over collars. Wind braces. Alternate rafters added - ? Tile replacement for thatch?

Very similar to "Quiller", over the road.
