sone Richard braburne one hundred pounds of lawfull monny  
to be payed when they be one and xx yeeres of age  
and I make my wife ane braburne

Exctrix of this my last will

and I will that my wife shall give my father

Thomas braburne £xx (£20) a yere as longe

as the said Thomas my father do live

I give to my sone Thomas braburne my house

at kinsterton(?) and the land after his mother ane (Anne)

braburne is deed to him & his heires for ever and I give to  
my sone Richard

braburne my house at Comtone

I pray m<sup>r</sup> Thomas alege(?) and

m<sup>r</sup> Antony Smetth to be overseers

to this my will

1. Henry Braburne appears to have written this himself, when he was ill. The writing is shaky, blotched, with many additions and omissions.
2. Willm Duptred, the rector of Albury, was the famous mathematician.
