In the name of God Amen the tenth (?) date of Aprill 1591 I John A Stone of Stonehouse in ye parische of Aldbery And in ye Countie of Surrey) beinge sicke in bodie but of good & perfecte remembrance Thanks be given unto Allmightye God doo ordaine & make this my Last will & Testament in manner & forme followinge, Firste I bequeathie my soule to All-  
- mightye God my maker & creator believeinge to be saved by ye meritts of Jesus Christ my Saviour & redemer And my bodie to be buried in some convenient place at ye discretion of my executor & overseers under named, Item I give unto ye poore of ye said parische <sup>iiiij<sup>s</sup> iiii<sup>d</sup></sup> to be bestowed at ye discretion of my executor & overseers undernamed Item I give unto every one of my Godchildren <sup>iiiij<sup>d</sup></sup> Item I give unto Jane my wif all ye Furniture of ye parlor even as it now holdeyth standethe Item I give unto my Sone John twenty sheape to be delivered unto hym by ye discretion of my overseers undernamed All ye rest of my goodes beinge unbequeathed ——— After my Funeralls & Legacies discharged I give unto my Sone Thomas uppon conditione yt he shall fullie & Faithfullye discharge and paie all my debtes And to this end I ordaine & make ye said Thomas the sole executor of this my last will & Testament to see ye same executed & p(er)formed And I appoint m<sup>r</sup> Robert Cowper ye p(ar)son of o(u)r parische of Aldbery, Walter Butler of Cranlye & George Stonefowle (?) of Ewelhurst to be ye overseers of ye same And I give unto them for their paines herein to be taken(?) over and above their necessary charges and expences that is to saie to saie to saie Robert Cowper six shillings & eight pence And to the other two three shillings foure pence Apece And soo the Lord have m(er)cie vppon me In witness therof this is my true & Last will I have sette my marke the daye & yere firste Above written
