22<sup>nd</sup> Febr 1641/2

In the name of god Amen the two and twentieth day of february in the  
yeare of our Lord god 1641 I Richard Chewell of Womersh in the Countrey  
of Surrey husbandman being sicke in body but yet in good and perfect  
remembrance (I thanke god for it) doe make and ordayne this my last  
will and testament in maner and forme following first I bequeath my  
soule into the hands of Almighty god that gave it trusting to be saved by the  
only merits and mediation of Jesus Christ: my body I leave to the earth  
to be buried in Christian buriall in place convenient at the discretion of  
my Executors and Overseers hereunder named in sweer and Certayne hope  
of the resurrection unto life immortal and for my earthly goods which god hath  
lent me I dispose of them as followeth first I give and bequeath unto my  
daughter Margret five and twenty poundes of lawfull English money  
and five poundes more of like money which her grandmothe gave  
her to be payd her within six monthes after my decease Item  
I give unto my daughter Marcy five and twenty poundes of lawfull  
English money to be payd her within six monthes after my decease  
Item I give unto my sonne John six poundes thirtene shillings and  
four pence to be payd him within six monthes after my decease  
Item I give unto my sonne Richard five and thirtie poundes of lawfull  
English money to be payd him within three monthes after my decease  
Item I give unto my sonne Thomas five and thirtie poundes of lawfull  
English money to be payd him within three monthes after my decease

Item I give unto my daughter Crisley five and twenty pounds of lawfull English money to be payd her within three months after my decease

Item I give unto my four daughters all my Shutes to be equali divided amongst them And if any of my sayd Children doe dye before

they receive theyre portions then his or her portion so deceased shall be equali divided amongst those that are living And altho ever of my sayd

Children shall have theyre several peices of rent as was given them by theyr godfathers and godmothers Item my will and meaning is that all those

legayces and portions that are given unto Crisley Richard and Thomas shall be put or employed to the best advantage of the sayd Children until they shall

accomplish theyr several ages of one and twenty years by my Executrix and overseers hereundernamed The rest of my goods and Chattells not here

bequeathed (my legayces and funerall expenses deducted) I give unto my daughter Sara whom I make sole Executrix of this my last will and

testament And I would intreat my brother in law Thomas Street and my kinsman Richard West to be overseers of this my last will and

testament allowing them forther paynes herein to be taken over and above theyre reasonable Charges twelve pence the peice in witness

whereof I have set to my hand and seale And so the Lord have mercy upon me
